# AmeriCorps Watershed Ambassador Visit

As part of the STEM programing for the Satellite After School Programs, the students had a lesson on what lives in the water in our area. 

# **Grants Awarded**

Bristol-Myers Squibb awarded \$1,425, in May 2015, for environmental science programs for South Broad St., East State Street Center & 4 Hamilton Township Satellite School's programs. The Mercer County Naturalist from the Tulpehaking Nature Center is providing the programs.

Dombal-Vogel Foundation awarded \$3,300, in June 2015, for East State Street Center summer camp field trips.

The Mary Owen Borden Foundation awarded \$15,000 in June 2015, towards the purchase of the new bus.

The City of Trenton awarded 2 grants to CYO, through the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) program, in July 2015, as follows: \$25,500 for South Broad St. Center's REC program & \$17,000 for East State Street Center summer camp.

I Am Trenton Community Foundation awarded \$750, in October 2015, for South Broad St. Center's ASP tutoring program.

PSEG Foundation awarded \$5,000 in October 2015, for Audubon Society bird watching projects in the Hamilton Township satellite schools after school programs.
