The Mercer County CYO Soccer Season began on Tuesday, April 18th. This year there are 5 teams (Our Lady of Sorrows / St. Anthony's, St. Ann's, St. Gregory's, St. Paul's, St. Raphael's / Holy Angels and Trenton Catholic Academy) participating in the CYO Boys Soccer League. Games take place weeknights at Mercer County Park, OLS & TCPA. The regular season is scheduled to conclude at the end of May with the playoffs taking place in early June.

CYO Basketball:

The Mercer County CYO celebrated its 70th year of CYO Basketball during the 2022-23 season. Newest Fad at South Broad Street


